Biography of Molly Joseph

Born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in the Golden Age of Television, Molly Joseph was raised in the shadow of the family T.V. console airing Ed Sullivan, Ozzie and Harriet, and Leave it to Beaver.

After earning an environmental design degree from Philadelphia College of Art, she migrated west only to discover that what she thought were real places existed only on the back lots and sound stages of Hollywood.

Soon she fell in with film people and received a grant to attend the American Film Institute Center for Advanced Film Studies as the first (and only) production design fellow. A crash course in film design and production then led her to NBC Television Studios in Burbank, now NBCUniversal.

With a few detours for film, a primetime soap, and the birth of her two daughters, Molly remains there today as the only unassigned staff art director. From her office on the Universal lot she designs press events, corporate meetings, west coast projects for CNBC and Network News, KNBC, and the NBC broadcast booth for the annual Tournament of Roses Parade.
